

Welcome to the world of Buggy Kingdom: A marvelous land of beautiful, picturesque mountains and lush green valleys. And what would Buggy Kingdom be without its citizens the bugs! So begins, “Little Insects,” a modern parable about the joys of sharing and friendship, and the disastrous consequences of selfishness and intolerance. This witty, exciting, and colorful tale is a modern classic that will be cherished by children and adults alike.

In “Little Insects,” we enter a whimsical land populated by talking ants, bees, caterpillars, grasshoppers and colorful butterflies – with wacky names such as Captain Kookie, Lady Moopsi, General Redeye, Queen Tilla, King Bigwig, Kin Foptop, Queen Palooma, Gromp, and General Blackpot. Our fairy tale opens when the charming Sir Sneekleberry (David Naughton, “American Werewolf in London”), the official historian of Buggy Kingdom, tells Naughton, “American

When ant leaders King Bigwig and King Foptop (Zach Galligan “Gremlins”, “Waxwork”) happen upon a jar of jam left over from a picnic, their selfish behavior and refusal to share their good fortune leads to a division of the ant population. King Bigwig leads his ants down into the Valley, and King Foptop takes his ants up into the Mountains – where both sides are doomed to an existence of suspicion and mistrust.

But in a Kingdom which desperately needs a kind heart, we meet Prince Dando of the Valley Ants. He is a poet, a singer, and not at all interested in the war brewing between the Mountain Ants and the Valley Ants. When Dando and his best buddy, the lovelorn Buzz the Bumblebee (Adrian Amed “T.J. Hooker” TV, “Bachelor Party”), fly high over the Mountain Ant kingdom in an innocent attempt to stop the hostilities, it sets off a chain reaction of misunderstandings which brings both sides to the brink of war. During his flight, Prince Dando catches a glimpse of the most beautiful creature he’s ever seen – Princess Dayzie of the Mountain Ants (Mia Sara “20,000 Leagues Under The Sea”, “Ferris Bueller’s Day Off”).

In order to unite both Mountain Ants and Valley Ants again, and more importantly, in his quest to charm the beautiful Princess Dayzie, Prince Dando goes undercover into the Mountain Ant Camp. There he meets Teebo, a fast-talking, quick-thinking ant who knows all the angles. Teebo talks Prince Dando into entering the dangerous jousting competition as a way of impressing Princess Dayzie. With a little bit of luck and a well-timed duck, Prince Dando defeats the challenger, Sir Spike, and becomes the new hero of the Mountain Ants. Using strawberry catapults, everything seems hopeless – until Prince Dando and his buddy Buzz fly in to the rescue. And when both sides see Prince Dando risk his life to save his one true love, the beautiful Princess Dayzie, their eyes are finally opened – and they see the folly of war.

Prince Dando and Princess Dayzie are married in a wonderful ceremony, which touches off a rebirth of peace and happiness in Buggy Kingdom – and they all live happily ever after.
